Judge Day called the meeting to order at 5:30 p.m.

Resolution to accept 2023 Craighead County Audit, requiring audit reports be reviewed by the governing body, and to take appropriate action relating to each finding and recommendation contained in the report was read (A.C.A. 10-4-418 and A.C.A. 14-14-113). Justice Cline motions to accept and Justice Barnes second the motion. Judge Day opens comments, and we have a clean audit with no findings and the Sheriff's department has had a clean report with no findings for a second year in a row. Judge Day points out to pay attention to what really matters. Due to internal controls after the Kade Holiday incident, we have many checks and balances in place for both state and federal audits. Justice Allison questions why the Audit Report states significant risks identified as management override of controls, then goes on to say in their report they found nothing. Judge Day answers he has asked that himself, and it is just their standard letter. Justice Cline says that statement has been on every report since 1999.

Without further questions or comments Judge Day took a vote and the Resolution passed unanimously.
